

What is the Graduate Certificate?

The Graduate Certificate in Developmental Disabilities is a way to receive formal academic credit for a series of courses around developmental disabilities. Human services are interdisciplinary in nature. Therefore, the professional working in the field of developmental disabilities can benefit from an interdisciplinary approach to services, supports, and leadership.

Who Should Participate?

If you are working in human services or have plans to, this Certificate is for you. Students come with a wide variety of academic backgrounds, including education, law, rehabilitation sciences, psychology, social work, public health, among others.

Students will acquire a basic foundation in a number of specific, topical areas such as specialized healthcare services and financing, inclusive education, behavioral supports, employment options, advocacy, legislation, assistive technology, community living, aging with a disability, organizational development and theory, group facilitation, and research proposal development.

Admissions Process

Application is simple. Students who have a bachelor's degree are eligible to apply for admission to the Certificate. If you are not currently enrolled at the University of Kentucky, you must apply to the Graduate School as well as to the Certificate.
